My name is Jose Manuel Lopez Jr and I am a Santa Visits Alviso recipient graduate. I am originally from a city called Farmersville located in the Central Valley. At that time, the central valley did not have many educational choices. Being where I was from, Fresno state was the only option that was suitable to many students that were of low-income families. When I received my acceptance letter from San Jose State, it was like a dream come true. My dreams were instantly crushed a few weeks before I started my first semester. When I received my balance for what my first semester was going to cost, my initial reaction was to drop out.

My mother and father both come from agricultural working backgrounds. My mom at that time used to pick grapes, and my dad would was an irrigator for a kiwi farm. Both of my parents together made a little under \$30,000 a year. Somehow, they made it work for myself and my three siblings. With the little money they made, they somehow put me through my first year of college. It came at a sacrifice. What they didn't tell me is that they would work 14 hour days, they would go days without eating in order to feed me. Physically and mentally, I was burning them out. I didn't realize what they were going through until after my second year of college. I came home for the holidays and we didn't have enough money for food that Christmas. I remember eating alphabet soup as my parents just watched us eat. It wasn't until that moment that I realized that I couldn't put my family through that anymore. I started working in the fields with my dad whenever I got a chance. I would make just enough to the point where my parents could focus on themselves a little more instead of me. That did not take away from the mental and physical burnout that my parents were going through.

My fiancée Camille Ramirez was a scholarship recipient for an organization called Santa Visits Alviso. She encouraged me to participate and apply for their scholarship. Through the process, I was able to meet Judy and I was able to discuss my situation with her. Not once did I feel like there wasn't any help from her or the organization. Judy gave me the motivation that my family and I needed. With the help received from SVAF, along with work, I was able to pay off my college dues by myself. I was finally able to give my parents a break.

As for SVAF, I received more than just financial assistance, I received guidance and hope. From the start, Judy has helped me in an abundance of ways. I recall meeting with Judy for the first time and talking about my family and where I am from. She did not judge me and she saw what I was capable of. After hearing and seeing what she has done for the community, I made it a priority to be like her. I am now working for Proteus which is a non-profit organization that helps farm workers receive educational, financial, and family services. I specifically work in the education division of Proteus. In Alviso, my story was one of a kind because there are not a lot of farm workers in the area. Here in the central valley, everyone has the same story and we all struggle the same way. Students drop out of school to work in the fields to give aid for their family. My work lets me give them a different route to aid their family. I finally feel the joy that Judy gets when she sees her recipients because I get the same feeling when I see one of our students graduate. Thanks to Judy specifically, I am where I am. I don't think I will ever gather the right words to thank her for what she has done for me and my family. Judy isn't just the individual who granted me a scholarship; she has become a very important person to me that means just as much as my family.
